Beit Iksa is a Palestinian village situated approximately **9 km northwest of Jerusalem**



Area 7,989

Dunams, of which 7389 classified as "Area C" and **591** as "Area B"



Population

2,003



The village's

land was stolen

for the benefit of Israeli settlements and the Tel Aviv-Jerusalem railway



To enter and exit the village, residents have to pass through a military **checkpoint built in 2010**

Violations

The apartheid wall separates the village from its surrounding villages and towns, preventing farmers from working on their land.

The occupation authorities do not issue building permits nor permits to build annexes.
