

# Wadi Al-Siq

The Wadi Al-Siq Bedouin community is situated in the western part of Wadi Al-Makouk, which is located east of the village of **Deir Dibwan in the Ramallah** District. It is positioned along the "Alon" settlement bypass road, connecting the northern and southern regions of Palestine. To the north, it is bordered by the Al-Marjat (Ramallah - Jericho) Road.



## Area

The community is located on a high plateau  
**Its area is 5 km**

The community is bordered by the settlements of Maale Mikhmas and Ramonim

## Population

**200** people  
Distributed among forty families

Its population originated from the city of Beer al Sabe' and the Tal Arad area  
**They were displaced in 1948**  
They depend on raising sheep

## Violations

- Residents of the community depend on solar cells to supply electricity.
- They buy water for high amounts because the occupation authorities refuses to provide water to the community as a result of repeated settler attacks.
- Families in Wadi Al-Siq began to move to other areas in search of safety and livelihoods, and their deportation concluded in October 2023, with the departure of **180 residents to the gathering, including 40 children.**
